Key Updates and Highlights

Leadership and Staffing

- New Chief Executive for Salford: Stephen Young has joined Salford City Council. Plans are underway for him to engage with the SSAB.
- **SSAB Team Updates:** A new Training and Development Officer has been appointed. Recruitment for additional support roles is ongoing.

Safeguarding Adults Week

- Plans are in motion to celebrate "Safer Cultures", highlighting positive safeguarding stories from adults and staff.
- An online event is being considered, and daily spotlight emails will showcase the work of SSAB subgroups.

Training Resources

- SSAB has produced several **7-minute briefings** on topics like:
 - Equality, Diversity & Inclusion
 - Unconscious Bias
 - Making Safeguarding Personal
 - Professional Curiosity
 These are publicly available on the SSAB website.

Partner Reports

- Organisations submitted exception reports to highlight risks and progress:
 - Healthwatch raised concerns about the potential closure of Healthwatch services nationally.
 - Adult Social Care flagged issues with Care Act compliance and safeguarding data.
 - GMMH reported concerns about safeguarding contacts being closed too early.

Subgroup Updates

- Safeguarding Effectiveness Group (SEG): Focused on improving data quality and safeguarding practices.
- **SWDG Group:** Concerns raised about limited adult service representation. Organisations are reviewing how to ensure adult voices are heard.
- SAR Panel: No new referrals this quarter.

Greater Manchester Developments

- Salford is contributing to regional efforts to streamline safeguarding, including:
 - A shared referral form
 - A unified data set
 - A GM-wide self-assessment tool

Quality Assurance Subgroup Proposal

• A new subgroup is proposed to improve oversight of safeguarding audits and learning. Terms of reference are being drafted.

Equality, Diversity & Inclusion (EDI) Audit

- A multi-agency audit explored how inclusive safeguarding practices are across Salford.
- Key findings:
 - Most agencies have EDI policies.
 - Data collection varies, with gaps in areas like care leaver status and preferred pronouns.
 - Recommendations include improving data capture and engaging with underrepresented groups.

Person in Position of Trust (PiPoT)

- A new referral process and resources have been launched to improve how concerns about professionals are handled.
- A mini audit is planned to assess awareness and effectiveness.

Voice of the Adult

- Feedback was gathered from five adults involved in safeguarding:
 - Issues included lack of awareness of safeguarding meetings and inappropriate placements.

 Positive outcomes were noted in some cases, such as improved safety and independence.

Learning from these cases is being shared to improve future practice.

Care Act Compliance

 Adult Social Care is addressing concerns about safeguarding systems and processes.

• A dedicated safeguarding team has been launched.

• Health partners requested earlier involvement in planning and implementation.

Prevent and Counter-Terrorism

• Updates were shared on national changes to the Prevent programme, including a focus on individuals with a fascination with violence.

Salford is reviewing its approach to ensure effective safeguarding responses.

Child Safeguarding Review

• A tragic case involving a child with complex needs highlighted the need for better collaboration between adult and children's services.

 Actions include developing joint assessments and improving mental health support for parent-carers.

Updates to existing risks like PiPoT and Right Care, Right Person

Next Steps

Continued focus on improving safeguarding systems and inclusive practices.
